We will dedicate our pledges on November 13. After worship, the Stewardship committee will be hosting a lunch in Koinonia hall, COVID permitting. Please join us!



WHY WE SERVE: WESTMINSTER'S OFFICERS ON WHY THIS SERVICE MATTERS TO THEM AND TO THE CHURCH

Every summer, Westminster's Nominating Committee begins meeting to determine who will be asked to serve as elders and deacons. Elders and deacons help govern and nurture the congregation. Throughout the fall, different Taizé: A brief prayer service in the elders and deacons will be offering "Minutes for Nominating" at the start of worship, discussing their reasons for serving the congregation in their respective roles. In October, we heard from elders Margi Coxwell and Keri Brinegar. Here's what they had to say about why they serve!

When and where were you ordained?

MC: I was ordained as an elder in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Billings, MT in the eighties.

KB: I was first ordained at Immanuel Presbyterian Church in Albuquerque in 2006.

How many times have you been installed?

MC: Once in Billings, once in Aberdeen, and twice here.

KB: I have been installed twice as an elder and once as a deacon.

Why did you agree to serve as an elder at Westminster?

MC: I had a number of reasons. My father's always very active in the church - he was an elder, and e was a clerk of the presbytery. When I was asked, I was so honored and felt like it was following in my dad's footsteps. I also thought about everything God has done for me and it would be a chance to give back.

It Takes a Village: Four Churches Support Afghan Evacuee Family

When the Afghan government collapsed and the Taliban seized power in August 2021, the US airlifted thousands of vulnerable Afghans and their families to the United States. Many of those families came to Santa Fe. Organizations and churches were encouraged to support • Serve as liaisons to school administrators these evacuees, and Westminster quickly mobilized to do so!

We were connected with the Ibrahimis, a family of 8, including 6 children. The family was especially vulnerable because the dad was in the Afghan military and volunteered to serve with American forces as they fought against the Taliban. The family did not speak English when they arrived, so their support needs have been great.

As the size of the task became apparent, Westminster was approached by several area churches offering support and wanting to help. Quickly, what had been Westminster's effort became a co-operative effort, and our team expanded to include:

- Westminster Presbyterian Church, Santa Fe
- First Presbyterian Church, Santa Fe
- White Rock Presbyterian Church
- White Rock United Methodist Church

The congregations jointly raised funds to help resettle the family, and church volunteers are helping the Ibrahimis integrate into our community. The volunteers have given many hours of their time to:

- Move the family into a rental apartment and furnish it completely
- Tutor the parents and children in English and all school subjects
- and teachers to address unmet needs
- Find and purchase a vehicle for the family and help the father get a drivers' license
- Help find a good job in a safe environment for the father of the family
- Coordinate medical and dental appointments for the family
- Transportation to cultural enrichment events in Santa Fe and Albuquerque
- Mentor the family on financial issues
- Assist with immigration requirements
- Become friends with the family

And the list is likely longer. Over the last nine months, volunteers from all four congregations have spent hundreds of hours working together to support the Ibrahimi family. No single congregation could have supplied enough funds or volunteers to help a family of this size with such need. Instead, God has provided a unique opportunity for our church partnership to help them settle into a new country, one in which the five Ibrahimi girls can attend school for the first time and choose any profession they wish. 

During this season of pandemic, we continue to be the church, worshiping God together even though we are not all together in one space. In God, we are made one church, bigger than any building might contain. Our COVID-19 Safe Protocols are part of our response to God's call to care for the vulnerable among us. As Christians, we believe it is important to live out our care for one another and the wider community by following our protocols.

Our matrix is an easy-to-use guideline for where we are in our COVID-19 restrictions. You will find an announcement bar on our website, updated weekly, with the current CDC Community Levels. Our COVID-19 Safe Protocols will be communicated to the congregation on the website, in *El Semanario*, and via signage.

f you have previously downloaded a copy of our guidelines, and are unsure if it is the most recent version, you can check the "approval" date directly below the title. The current version, accessible here, has an approval date of 7/28/22. If substantive changes are made to the guidelines or matrix, we will notify the congregation via email. In addition, an email will go out on any Friday when we are moving from one level to another so that worship attendees can be prepared for any changes to Sunday's worship!

If you cannot abide by our protocols, you do not feel safe attending in-person worship at this time, you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, or have tested positive for COVID-19, (or if you don't feel up to coming in to church this Sunday!) you are welcome to join our online congregation! Every Sunday at 11am, as people are gathering in person at the church building, we are also streaming via Facebook Live. A bulletin can be accessed in the comments of the Live video so that you can participate fully with us! All are welcome to worship with us, whichever way feels most appropriate for you!
