QUERIDO WESTMINSTER:

Spring is truly here in New Mexico, despite an April 28 snowstorm! Our spring bulbs are just about finished blooming, the lilacs are starting to bloom, and our fruit trees have a flush of buds. What a wonderful time of year - this season makes it easy to remember God's blessings in our lives!

Last month was a busy one for us as a congregation - Holy Week and Easter, Creation Care Sunday, and a work trip from Menaul students all were special events in April! The building's woodwork received a fresh coat of blue paint in time for Easter, and of course our indomitable committees continued their work. We launched a new committee, Evangelism and Outreach, who had their inaugural meeting on April 11.

Also on April 11, a major milestone passed us by - the anniversary of our commissioning as a congregation by this Presbytery. We officially met as a congregation on July 15, 1893, but it was this April 11 commissioning that helped form us as a body! At the time, this church was named *La Iglesia Seguna Presbiteriana (Hispañola) de Santa Fe.* From 1893 through the 1930s, the congregation was Spanish-speaking in all aspects of life together. In the middle part of the 20th century, the congregation was bilingual, with two Spanish-language services and two English-language services a month. By the late 20th century, we had shifted to a primarily English-speaking congregation.

We adopted Westminster Presbyterian Church as our name in January of 1951, just a few years before the purchase of our current property (for \$3,000! Can you imagine?!) and the subsequent construction of our building, dedicated December 4, 1955. We celebrated our centennial in 1993. At that time, Libby Naranjo compiled a little history book, *Un Siglo de Recuerdos*, telling our history in brief. Over the summer, look for portions of this book here in *La Luz*, and on our website, as we continue to tell our story and remember our history as we move into the future.

We have been an active presence in Santa Fe for one hundred and thirty years - and look forward to many more years of work and mission in this city!

New Committee Starts Work!

The committee is looking seriously at the full list of ideas from those conversations, and focusing on ideas that don't have a home with another committee. Jicarita Cluster meeting on April 25

Westminster is a member of the Jicarita Cluster, a consortium of PC(USA) congregations in Northern New Mexico. These congregations were once called 'mission churches' - congregations who received mission work from others. Now we better understand ourselves to have much to offer each other, our Presbytery, and even the national church - not to mention our communities. The cluster met for our biannual meeting to have fellowship and do a bit of business. We support Loma Verde Camp, a Presbyterian camp outside Taos, and look forward to our work day there Memorial Day weekend.

The cluster includes congregations from Santa Fe, White Rock, Los Alamos, Mora, Truchas, Chimayo, Dixon, and Peñasco.



Our Taizé worship group, ably coordinated by Marianne Lewis, and led by a rotation of leaders including Michael Brinegar, Bill Humphreys, and Georgia Ortiz, has been gathering online via Zoom since the COVID-19 pandemic began. Their group has expanded to include people who join from out-of-state. They have worked together to figure out how to best share the sung prayers that are the foundation of Taizé - they now know that Marianne's home phone provides the best sound quality!

As COVID-19 is turning from pandemic to endemic, the leadership team has been having conversations about how to continue the community they have built online *and* how to transition back to some in-person gathering. Local members of the Taizé group long to be in person; members who join from far-away worry about losing this important weekly spiritual practice.

Westminster's Taizé worship group will begin gathering inperson once a month, on Thursday April 13 at 5:30 pm in our sanctuary! They will continue to gather via Zoom on the other Thursdays of the month at 5:30pm.



From Money Cares:


- Opened a new savings account at DNCU to purchase 17month CD at 4.05% return - approved by Session

From Creation Care:

 On-going/up-coming projects/proposals: can we convert to an all-electric church?; conduct an energy audit; purchasing rain barrels and/or other water reduction opportunities

The Session also voted on an amendment to our Bylaws. Any amendment to the bylaws must be approved by the congregation in a congregational meeting; look for this when we have our Annual Meeting next year! The revision is intended to allow the congregation some flexibility by allowing for 4th quarter terms of call revision, election of church officers, and election of Congregational Nominating Committee.

How many times have we seen a modern building, an historic landmark, a great cathedral or a monument and thought, "How did they do that?" Regardless of when it was built, the skill and craftsmanship needed to not only imagine it, but to make it sturdy enough to safely and securely withstand the test of time, boggles the mind.

We will dedicate our Pentecost Offering on Sunday May 28! The offering is split in the following manner: 40% remains at Westminster for local support of at-risk youth; 25% to the Young Adult Volunteer Program; 25% to ministries with youth; and 10% to support at-risk children.

One Great Hour of Sharing Offering Received on Easter Sunday!

On Sunday May 9, Easter Sunday, Westminster dedicated our One Great Hour of Sharing Offering. One Great Hour of Sharing provides relief from natural disasters, food for the hungry, and support for the poor and oppressed. We had an amazing response to this offering, which helps repair people's lives. The total received (as of April 20, 2023) was \$2,279. This is an increase of 85% over last year!

The monies received in this offering are shared between three programs in the PC(USA): Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), and the Self-Development of Peoples (SDOP). PDA works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees, and receives 32% of funds raised. PHP takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation, and address the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed, and receives 36% of funds raised. SDOP invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice and educates Presbyterians about the impact of these issues, and receives 32% of funds raised.

A huge thank you to all who supported One Great Hour of Sharing this year. Our gifts will make tangible differences in peoples lives, locally, nationally, and internationally. Thank you.

Let us pray: Restoring God, you have called us to repair what in this world you love so much that has been broken. May the repairs made through our gifts bring life to communities in need and bring praise to your holy name. Amen.

If we all do a little, it adds up to a lot!

River Otters on the Caja del Rio!

Did you know: Between 2008 and 2010, 33 river otters were released into the upper Rio Grande. Since then, there have been many sightings of these intelligent and playful animals, some as far south as Cochiti Lake!

The playful North American river otter is well adapted for semi-aquatic living. The mammals have thick, protective fur to help them keep warm while swimming in cold waters. They have short legs, webbed feet for faster swimming, and a long, narrow body and flattened head for streamlined movement in the water. On land a river otter can run at speeds of up to 15 miles an hour—they can slide even faster. Their playful snow and mud

sliding, tail chasing, water play, and snow burrowing activities also serve other purposes—they help strengthen social bonds and let young otters practice hunting techniques.

A river otter can grow three to four feet long including its tail and weigh between 11 and 30 pounds. River otters eat a variety of aquatic wildlife, such as fish, crayfish, crabs, frogs, birds' eggs, birds and reptiles such as turtles. They have also been known to eat aquatic plants and to prey on other small mammals, such as muskrats or rabbits. They have a very high metabolism, so they need to eat frequently. In the 19th century, the animals were trapped out of existence in much of their historic range.

During this season of pandemic, we continue to be the church, worshiping God together even though we are not all together in one space. In God, we are made one church, bigger than any building might contain. Our COVID-19 Safe Protocols are part of our response to God's call to care for the vulnerable among us. As Christians, we believe it is important to live out our care for one another and the wider community by following our protocols.

Our matrix is an easy-to-use guideline for where we are in our COVID-19 restrictions. You will find an announcement bar on our website, updated regularly, with the current CDC Community Levels. Our COVID-19 Safe Protocols will be communicated to the congregation on the website and in *El Semanario*. The current version of the matrix, accessible here, has an approval date of 12/18/22. If substantive changes are made to the guidelines or matrix, we will notify the congregation via email. An email will go out on any Friday when we move from one level to another, so that worship attendees can be prepared for any changes to Sunday's worship!

If you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, or have tested positive for COVID-19, (or if you don't feel up to coming in to church this Sunday!) you are welcome to join our online congregation! Every Sunday at 11am, as people are gathering in person at the church building, we are also streaming via YouTube. A bulletin can be accessed in the comments of the Live video so that you can participate fully with us!

All are welcome to worship with us, whichever way feels most appropriate for you!
