# Q UERIDO WESTMINSTER:

I love this time of year, as the nights cool off and the days begin to shorten but remain sunny and warm. Thunderstorms roll in, and even if your neighborhood doesn't get any rain, there's something wonderful about knowing that someone, somewhere nearby is getting drenched. And though people tend to think of spring as a time of renewal, there's something to be said for this time of year as well. Children have just headed back to school; program calendars are ramping up. It feels like a time for fresh notebooks and pointy pencils, for new shoes and the beginning of pumpkin-spice-latte season.

At Westminster, we're wrapping up our summer sermon series on the Older Testament, as we read through Genesis and the very beginning of Exodus. These ancient stories are the backbone of our faith, and we can glean much about God - and our relationship to God - from them. We started with creation, and then moved through the patriarchs: Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph. We were reminded of God's care for the outsider and the cast-aside; of God's unexpected choices in heroes. And we were reminded that from the very beginning, God has called us into ministry; has called us into working together with God to bring about God's beloved community.

This summer also saw a number of fun congregational events - from Pride in mid-June to multiple guest musicians in July to attending a baseball game in Albuquerque in August! We also packed lunches for Chaplain Joe and spent much time sprucing up the church grounds. In many ways, this summer was really our first opportunity to do all the community events we have been missing, now that our COVID-19 restrictions have lifted. I hope all of you enjoyed it as much as I did!

Of course, wrapping up summer means kicking off fall! We'll begin the program year with worship in the mountains on September 10 as we celebrate 130 years of ministry in Santa Fe (see page 6 for more details). During the fall, I'll be working with the Creation Care Committee on an environmentally focused educational series. I'll also be working with some of you who have expressed interest in having a Sunday morning educational offering. We'll be launching a new section on our website, which will focus on our outreach - Missio Dei and Creation Care. After the summer break on our Agape Fast, we'll begin gathering on the fourth Sunday of the month for a simple meal to raise money and awareness for hunger in Santa Fe and around the world. And before you know it, we'll be in Advent!

#### Westminster Commissions Photographers on August 20

In the life of the church, we understand that all members are active participants in Christ's ministry - in what we call "the priesthood of all believers." Each of us, from the day we are born

until the day we die, is part of Christ's ministry in the world. None of the forms of ministry are more important than any other, and yet it is also true that some are called to particular forms of ministry. The forms we think of are 'ordered ministries' - minister of word and sacrament, elder, deacon, and yet there are others. For those specific ministries that are determined by the needs of a particular congregation, instead of ordination we have commissioning. Commissioning is how we, as a congregation, recognize

the call of God on particular persons within our congregation who are called to particular service and mission in the church and in the world.

Today we commission Susanne Hinkle, Kent DeYoung, and Alan Tway as Westminster's photographers, recognizing the call God has placed on them to serve the church in that role. As photographers, Susanne, Kent, and Alan are responsible for capturing the life of Westminster so that we can expand our witness to ourselves and to the world.

## Contemplative Worship

**Taizé**: A brief prayer service in the style of the Taizé Brothers in France is held on Thursdays at 5:30pm. It is a time of scripture, prayer, chants and silence. Second Saturday Quiet Space: On the second Saturday of the month, we gather at 10am for a creative, contemplative gathering. We will read Scripture, pray together, and hold a time of silence. Within that structure, Quiet Space is a time for creativity and contemplation; every month will be a different experience.



#### **Matthew 25 Update:**

#### Westminster working with First Pres!

As WPC and First Presbyterian have sought ways to work together on mission-related projects, we recently agreed to partner on our Matthew 25 Fund to help those in our Santa Fe community struggling with life issues. Members from both churches are now voting on applications received from the community and vetted through Santa Fe Connect Navigators and other non-profit organizations. We have provided financial assistance to nearly 50 individuals and families since the beginning of 2023.

Who in our community have we helped recently with Matthew 25 Funds? A few highlights:

- A mother of three children whose partner the primary breadwinner suddenly passed away recently, leaving the family with a minimal income. The mother can only find part time work, cleaning a box store at night. They are in financial crisis. We paid her rent for one month and provided a Walmart gift card for groceries and other needs. We are also looking for other ways to help this family.
- A 98-year-old grandmother living on \$500 a month from Social Security. She had to install a
  new heating system in her small adobe home and is now behind in paying her gas bill. We
  paid her NM Gas bill.
- A female cancer patient undergoing treatment who cannot pay her rent due to her health challenges. Her landlords have been threatening to take legal action if she cannot pay rent on time. We helped pay her part of her past-due amount.
- An elderly man diagnosed with stage 4 emphysema, is unable to work, and is on hospice. He has received public assistance before and so is not eligible for additional assistance until 2024. We helped pay his past due utility bill.

One of our recent Matthew 25 applicants wrote a hand-written note to WPC, thanking us for our help. His note read: "I thank [you for] all the help you can give me. I believe in Jesus Christ the Lord Almighty and the kindness in all your hearts for trying to help me. Your generosity is a beacon of light for all to see."

We do this work through your generous contributions to the Matthew 25 Fund. If you would like to donate, please make checks payable to Westminster Presbyterian Church, with "Matthew 25" on the memo line. Your contributions matter to our community.

### **Afghan 225 Initiative Update**

WPC continues to wire transfer approximately \$300 into Kabul each month to help Afghan families experiencing food and living insecurity. The funds go directly to the family of WPC friends living in Kabul; they, in turn, distribute the funds to individuals and families in dire need. This month, there were two recipients:

- A widow, unable to work, and trying to support and feed five children
- A father of three children, also unable to work because he is battling Leukemia

Your donations into this special WPC fund bypass the Taliban government and go directly to those in need. If you would like to contribute to the fund, you may write a check to WPC, with "Afghan 225 Initiative" on the memo line.

#### HAVE YOU WONDERED WHY WE CALL IT AEGHAN 225?

When we first began to wire funds into Afghanistan in 2021, \$225 was the dollar limit of what could be sent into the country in a wire transaction. Although the current limit of monthly fund transfers has increased to \$300, we retain the fund name of 'Afghan 225'.

## Per Capita and Westminster

We've said goodbye to our Afghan family as they moved to Baltimore in late July, and are working out what our team of four congregations will do next. For many of our volunteers, being part of a team was a huge part of what they loved about supporting the family. That feeling of being part of a team, of a larger whole - that's what being Presbyterian means and where per capita comes from. Each head, each one, does a small part so that huge projects can be accomplished and wonderful things can happen for all.

We Presbyterians are big believers in "it takes a village"! Our annual budget includes paying our per capita and we, as WPC, pay our portion to the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly. Our support ensures that the larger bodies have the resources needed to provide the necessary support, ideas, and oversight to share our faith with the wider world, wider country, wider area of our state, and to each individual congregation as needed. The good old saying that it takes a village is so true. With each contributing, however able, we are creating connections - that's what Presbyterians strive to do in all our layers of being church - TOGETHER.

For 2023, each individual portion is \$37. If you are able to contribute this along with your pledge one week, it will go a long way to easing the total budget line of thousands of dollars that WPC will pay to the Presbytery - allowing us to stay connected and continue to do great things. \$37 is a small price to pay for such great benefits. Thank you!


When: Sunday September 10 at 11am
